**Get Ready to Caucus**

Precinct caucuses are the first of the methods for the Democratic voters to help choose our candidate for President of the United States. Each precinct within the 30<sup>th</sup> Legislative District will be assigned to caucus at one of the locations below. **It is vitally important that each person attend the correct caucus location.** There is no charge to attend and participate in the caucus, but donations to help cover our costs (approximately \$2000) of holding the caucuses are greatly appreciated.

**Preregistration** is highly encouraged and done by going to [www.wa-democrats.org](http://www.wa-democrats.org) and clicking on the "2016 Caucus" link in the upper right corner. Preregistration helps in 2 ways: 1) it speeds up registration at the caucus site and 2) it gives us an indication of how many will attend.

**Attendance** at the caucuses is open to anyone, however participation (including eligibility to be a delegate) is limited to those who are a registered voter in the particular precinct or who will turn 18 prior to November 9, 2016 and who are willing to be publicly known as a Democrat. Surrogate Affidavit forms are available at [www.wa-democrats.org](http://www.wa-democrats.org) to those who are unable to attend the caucus due to 1) participation in the observance of their religion, 2) military service or work schedule or 3) disability or illness. Surrogate forms must be received at the Washington State Democratic party office no later than Friday, March 18, 2016 at 5:00pm.

Delegates and alternates supporting the Presidential candidates will be chosen at the precinct caucuses. Those delegates will then move on to the Legislative District caucus on April 17 at Decatur High School.

## Holiday in Olympia: Lobby Day, Crab Feed

It was a busy day at the Capitol in Olympia on President's Day. Not only were our state legislators busy attending to important state matters, but the Capitol grounds were flooded with organizations, looking to make contact with many of those same legislators to ask for support and assistance, and to help them make decisions that will shape our state's economy for the upcoming year. Lobby Day! This year, our LD arrived with a smaller-than-usual contingent, but we were still determined to make our voices heard.

The morning started out with the gathering of other state Democrats in Senate Room #3. In this room we reviewed the contents of the many House and Senate Bills that are of deep concern to us in this Legislative Session, including those dealing with education, healthcare, labor, fair tenant screening, political disclosure requirements (especially for "dark money"), the environment, and of course revenue and taxes. We were briefed on bills and issues from many of our Democratic Legislators such as Representatives Tina Orwell (33<sup>rd</sup>), Tana Senn (41<sup>st</sup>), Zach Hudgins (11<sup>th</sup>), Jessyn Farrell (46<sup>th</sup>), and Senators Pramila Jayapal (37<sup>th</sup>) and Karen Keiser (33<sup>rd</sup>), just to name a few. Their message was mostly the same: it has been a very difficult and disappointing Session in regards to moving things forward, especially when it comes to creating revenue to fund basic education and complying with the McCleary Decision. As expected, the Senate Republicans are toeing their party line, and a lot of House bills that have been passed are not making it to the Senate floor for a vote. Although there is support for some bills, many are being held up in committee. State politics at its best!

Upon adjournment, we set out to speak to our 30<sup>th</sup> District Legislators. Because of their very busy schedules, we could only speak to Representatives Kochmar and Hickel in the halls of the Capitol building. This was a task in itself, as many others from other districts were doing the exact same thing at the same time, and there happened to be a rally in the rotunda, with the members of the rally chanting and clapping. Despite the distractions, we still presented our 30<sup>th</sup> LD Democrats' 2016 Agenda, and urged both

Representatives to consider and support our issues. They both listened intently and promised to at least look at our Agenda as to see how, if any, they could support the bills we presented.

After leaving the Capitol building we hurried to see Senator Miloscia. He was tied up in committee, but we had an in-depth conversation with his Legislative Aides about our Agenda. I felt that it was received very well, and I can say for myself that I felt that our requests would at least be discussed with the Senator.

Later, I got a chance to speak to Senator Miloscia in person while visiting the Senate Gallery. He saw Bernie Knighton and me sitting above him, and came off of the floor to speak to us. I told him that we had left our agenda with his aides, and asked him to support our bills. He did tell us that he was working on a homeless bill for the 30<sup>th</sup>, and we thanked him.

As we headed from the Capitol to St. Martin's College for the Democrats' Crab Feed, I wasn't optimistic about our chances of having our 30<sup>th</sup> District legislators support our bills, but at least we made our point.

The Crab Feed started out slow, but quickly picked-up momentum, as the room filled and conversations echoed within the large assembly. Democrats from throughout Washington State enjoyed the networking and fellowship that an event of this type can bring.

Guest speakers included Governor Jay Inslee, Senator Patty Murray, Congresswoman Suzan DelBene, Congressmen Rick Larsen, Derek Kilmer, and Denny Heck. State Legislators Mia Gregerson (33<sup>rd</sup>) and Chirstine Rolfes (23<sup>rd</sup>) also spoke, and they all helped raise our spirits and gave us hope for 2016, including electing another Democrat for President of the United States. The food was plentiful and atmosphere upbeat. It was a great closing event for a busy day in Olympia. If you have never attended the annual Crab Feed, you should plan to in the future. It's worth the time and it will re-energize you.

We all know that for our State to move forward, to be progressive, and most of all to obtain quality education to support our state's children, it will be an uphill battle this coming election year. Our goal this year is to elect Democrats to the 30<sup>th</sup> District, and to do that, we will need your support in the coming months to achieve this.
