I-1631 Endorsement Resolution

A resolution related to endorsing I-1631, a statewide initiative to the people that would charge pollution fees on the largest corporate polluters and use the revenue to invest in healthy communities, clean our air and water, promote clean energy, and slow down the impacts of climate change—all under oversight of a public board.

WHEREAS, we all deserve to breath clean air, drink healthy water, and live in protected environments,

WHEREAS, pollution is a threat to the health of our community and all communities across Washington state,

WHEREAS, a transition from polluting fossil fuel energy to clean energy will create thousands of high-paying local jobs that contribute to local economies, in rural and urban communities alike, without hurting the health of their neighbors,

WHEREAS, the largest corporate polluters causing the most damage to our health are currently not being held accountable to the damage they're doing to our communities,

WHEREAS, over 600,000 Washingtonians live with asthma and thousands more suffer from upper respiratory illnesses and diseases caused by air pollution,

WHEREAS, the protection of communities disproportionately harmed by pollution should be prioritized and investments targeted to provide direct, meaningful, and assured benefits to those communities,

WHEREAS, policies should provide consumers with affordable, cleaner, and more efficient fuel and energy choices,

WHEREAS, adequate assistance must be provided to families with low incomes as we transition to clean energy,

WHEREAS, Washington state has an opportunity and responsibility to lead the nation and set an example in how to address pollution and climate change,

WHEREAS, we have a responsibility to invest in our state's natural resources, which are vital to our state's economy and industries like agriculture, timber, tourism, and fishing,

WHEREAS, the resiliency of our natural resources protects our health by reducing pollution in the air and water, and secures our community by lowering the risk of fires, floods, and landslides,

WHEREAS, we must restore and protect estuaries, fisheries, and marine shoreline habitats; prepare for sea level rise; increase sustainable supply of water; and improve infrastructure for treating stormwater,

WHEREAS, investments should be made with strong public oversight and accountability,



WHEREAS, state policies should respect tribal sovereignty and consult affected communities and tribal nations,

WHEREAS, I-1631 was shaped by tribal nations and communities most affected by pollution and climate change, and is supported by an unprecedented coalition of labor unions, environmental and economic justice advocates, healthcare professionals, and more,

WHEREAS, we recognize the need to pass on a safe healthy environment for our children and future generations of Washingtonians,

THEREFORE, as a matter before this body, we move to publicly endorse initiative I-1631—highlighting our support for its principles and urging voters to sign the petition and vote yes upon qualification.

A Resolution to amend Article V of the WSDCC Charter and Article IX of the Bylaws of the Democratic Party of the State of Washington

WHEREAS Chapter 29a.80 RCW and WAC 434-230-100 do not address duties of political party precinct committee officers; and

WHEREAS Article IX, B5 of the Charter of the Democratic Party of the State of Washington states:

Proposed Bylaws Amendments shall be reviewed by the Rules Committee of the SCC or such other standing committee as the SCC shall designate in its Bylaws and such reviewing Committee by affirmative vote of a majority of its members may, but shall not be required to, recommend to the State Convention or SCC, whichever is appropriate, that one of the following actions be taken: a) the proposed Amendment should be passed; b) the proposed Amendment should be amended as recommended by the reviewing Committee and then passed; or c) the proposed Amendment should be rejected. Absence of a recommendation from the reviewing Committee shall not prevent the State Convention or SCC, whichever is appropriate, from considering a timely submitted proposed Amendment. No amendment of a proposed Bylaws Amendment may be considered by the State Convention or SCC except an amendment recommended by the reviewing Committee.

WHEREAS the WSDCC Charter, Article V, C1 states:

The legislative district organization shall be the governing body of the legislative district Democratic Party and shall have the responsibility for conducting Party affairs at the legislative district level. It shall be composed of all elected and appointed precinct committee officers.

WHEREAS the Bylaws of the Democratic Party of the State of Washington, Article IX, Section A and B, Legislative District Organizations state:

The legislative district organization shall be the governing body of the legislative district Democratic Party and shall have the responsibility for conducting Party affairs at the legislative district level. It shall be composed of all elected and appointed precinct committee officers.

In any legislative district organization, only elected precinct committee officers and precinct committee officers appointed after the organizational meeting shall vote for district chair, vice chair, state committeewoman, state committeeman and any representative the legislative district organization is authorized to send to other Party organizations, and on the adoption or amendment of bylaws. Legislative district organizations may allow other Democrats to participate in all other functions; and

WHEREAS the WSDCC Charter rules state in Article IX, A2:

This Charter may also be amended by affirmative vote of two-thirds of the entire membership of the SCC. An amendment must be proposed in writing by a member of the SCC and be published in full in the notice of the meeting of the SCC sent to each member of the committee. An amendment adopted by the SCC shall be subject to ratification by the next State Convention if a written request for ratification is presented in writing to the state chair by an elected delegate to the State Convention at least thirty (30) days before the convention.

and Article IX, B1:

The Democratic Party of the State of Washington shall adopt Bylaws to govern its affairs in those matters not fully specified by this Charter. The Bylaws should be consistent with and subject to this Charter, the Charter of the Democratic Party of the United States and provisions adopted pursuant to the authority of either Charter.

and Bylaws of the Democratic Party of the State of Washington Article XII Amendments, Rules state Bylaws may be amended by affirmative vote of a majority of the entire membership of the SCC (State Central Committee), or as provided in the Charter; and

WHEREAS Amendments to these Bylaws of the Democratic Party of the State of Washington must be presented in writing to the state chair by an SCC member at least fifteen (15) days prior to an SCC meeting or by an elected delegate to the State Convention thirty (30) days prior to the State Convention and the State Chair shall then publish the full text of the proposed amendment in the call no later than ten (10) days prior to the date of the meeting or convention.

WHEREAS to increase membership and participation at the local legislative district organization;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we, The 30th District Democrats of the State of Washington, call on the Democratic Party of the State of Washington to amend WSDCC Charter, Article V, C1 to read as follows:

The legislative district organization shall be the governing body of the legislative district Democratic Party and shall have the responsibility for conducting Party affairs at the legislative district level. It shall be composed of all elected and appointed precinct committee officers **and members in good standing**.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we, The 30th District Democrats of the State of Washington, call on the Democratic Party of the State of Washington to amend Article IX, Part A and B of the Bylaws of the Democratic Party of the State of Washington to read as follows:

In any legislative district organization, ~~only~~ elected precinct committee officers, ~~and~~ precinct committee officers appointed after the organizational meeting, **and members in good standing** shall vote for district chair, vice chair, state committeewoman, state committeeman and any representative the legislative district organization is authorized to send to other Party organizations, and on the adoption or amendment of bylaws. Legislative district organizations may allow other Democrats to participate in all other functions.
