WSDCC Review

WSDCC Spokane Convention | September 14-16, 2018

This could easily be entitled "SPOKANE - CAPE DISAPPOINTMENT" for many reasons. On my way over, I was notified by our chair that the 30th LDD Resolution regarding general membership voting for all leadership positions in all the Local District Parties, which would

require a change in the Constitution & Bylaws of the State Party, was moved into the Rules Committee for a DO PASS OR DO NOT PASS vote.

I attended the Rules Committee as I thought I would have an opportunity to speak on behalf of the Resolution; not true. The only people that could speak were members of the Rules Committee and that an LD Chair could have input as well. I attempted to enlist help of members of the Rules Committee but was rejected at every turn and finally someone said the Rules Committee voted DO NOT PASS on the measure.

Now I must mention as the sole representative from the 30th LDD in attendance at the convention, I had recently suffered a rear-end accident and to this day I have a pain in the neck and shoulder area that flares to the level that even oxycodone doesn't cut it.

As I left the Rules Committee disappointed, I was looking forward to being able to speak from the floor of the general meeting in favor of our Resolution. I again sought out supporters who would help push this forward to no avail.

Opposition reasoning was multifold: Disenfranchisement of PCOs, open the door to adverse takeover from hostile segments of a city, town, county (most often referred to in conversations as a GOP infiltration). I could find no one in support of the general proposition. I retaliated those comments by saying that it could be very important in our purple districts in membership building if general members could vote on leadership; fell on deaf ears.

It was suggested that if voting was important to general membership building then turn loose all the chair appointments and make them voter eligible positions. That made sense to some people in a group setting where we were talking about it; some stated that their LD already does this and has had a good impact on invigorating participation.

The long and short of it is because of my incredible shoulder and neck pain, I had to leave

early to get to the local ER and get pain pills and lidocaine patches for the long drive home. I was nearly in tears on the way over because of the pain and the thought of having to drive five plus hours in this extreme pain was very depressing. Laying down doesn't help, pressure against my neck and shoulder doesn't help, chiropractic adjustments have had some relief but it comes right back after a couple of days; it's here right now.

After all this, it's my feeling, in speaking with Madelyn Grayson as well, that we need to build a coalition of support from our neighboring LDs and get this in front of King County Democratic Central Committee. I am sorry if you feel I let our LD down but as I said it was my CAPE DISAPPOINTMENT moment in Spokane.

PCO Call to Action

Thank you to the PCOs who have been working on Get Out the Vote (GOTV) in your precincts, either through phone banking or walking your neighborhood. Voter turnout has been high with many early returns—let's keep up the work through November 6th!

As the year ends, some of our current Precinct Committee Officers (PCOs) will be retired on 12/1/18 and we welcome and install our new PCOs that were elected in the August 2018 primary.

One of the benefits of being a PCO is the opportunity to vote in the King County Reorganization meeting coming up on December 1st. The State Party's Charter and Bylaws require all county and legislative district party organizations to elect new officers (a process called "reorganization," often just referred to as "re-org") every two years, shortly after each even-year election. Only elected PCOs are permitted to vote for Chair, 1st Vice Chair, State Committeeman, and State Members (two positions of differing gender identification). You will also have the opportunity to vote for other officers in the King

County Democratic Central Committee (KCDCC).

The KCDCC Re-Org meeting is scheduled on Saturday, 12/1/18 at 9AM. It will be held at the Local 751 Boeing Machinists Hall (9125 15th Place South; Seattle 98108).

If you were elected to be a PCO in the August 7th primary, you are strongly encouraged to attend this meeting in December. Also, please mark your calendars for the 30th District Democrats Re-org meeting, which will be held on Wednesday, 1/2/18.

Federal Way Apprenticeships and Mentorship

At the last city council meeting, an apprenticeship utilization ordinance was passed. The ordinance requires certain projects over \$2,000,000 to have a minimum of 15% labor hours go to apprentices from the local community, where applicable, and when such individuals are available for such work.

The city council also passed a resolution for a city council membership program where each member of the council will be assigned a mentee from one of our high schools.
